

TRAVELS NEAR AND FAR...

Key West The Way It Was

Before my grandfather changed the name to "Captain Tony's Saloon" in 1964, it was called "The Oldest Bar" because it actually was the oldest bar in Key West, and if I'm not mistaken, the third oldest bar in the state of Florida, lots of drunken pirates back then and as there still are today!

The building was built in 1859, and it was the original city morgue and icehouse which serviced the morgue with ice it needed. Before it was called "The Oldest Bar" the name of it was "The Duval Club" as you could see on the neon sign on the side in this photo, that's sometime in the 40s when my grandfather first arrived in Key West, I like the Schlitz beer sign in front. Those are definitely two drunk sailors or fisherman hanging out front, when my grandfather took that bar over in 1964.

It was off-limits to all military personnel. It had a reputation for 50 years of gambling, prostitution, smugglers. The reason why that sign was sideways on the building was so the people from Duval Street could see that it was a club. That's why my grandfather hung that big fish above the sign in 1969 and the quarter in the fish's mouth thing was created by my grandfather's manager, Peter and me in 1976.

The building is haunted. I stayed above it enough times to know and closed it at 4 o'clock in the morning by myself to really feel the energy. It's the reason why I was inspired to write a book about its history.
