Dear Members:

With what's going on in the world, our nation, our state and our towns about the COVID 19 and the steps to mitigate exposure to the virus, we believe it makes sense to advise you that **SHBC will be cancelling all our scheduled Meetings and gatherings through at least April 30.**

While the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recommends that for the next 8 weeks, organizations cancel or postpone in-person visits of 50 or more people, other organizations have recommended gatherings be as low as 12 people. The advice from FLDOH and the CDC are continuously evolving. Just Last night a recommendation was made that bars and restaurants limit themselves to 50% capacity and close early.

Many of our members fall into the "high risk" category of people who are most vulnerable.

One of the ironies of this situation is that, only two or three people need be captain and crew of a power or sailboat, and one of the least risky places to contract the illness is out in the middle of Upper Tampa Bay. With that in mind, our race chair and Vice Commodore John Viverito will poll individual sailboat owners regarding Wednesday and Saturday races during the month of April. **For the month of March, all scheduled races have been cancelled.**

While we are all living with a new phrase, "social distancing", keep in mind that should not be akin to social isolation. We urge all members to keep in contact with others in our club and your other organizations to whom you may belong. **If you find yourself in need of a friendly voice, remember these words:**
